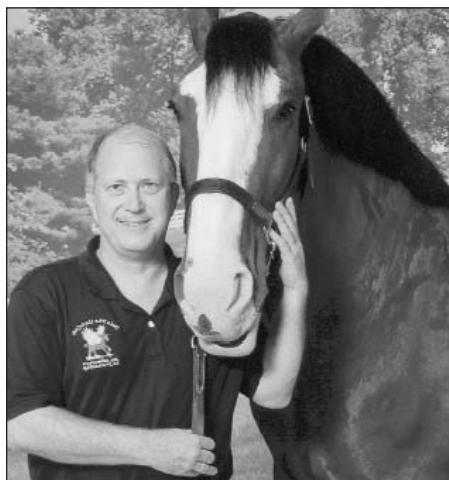

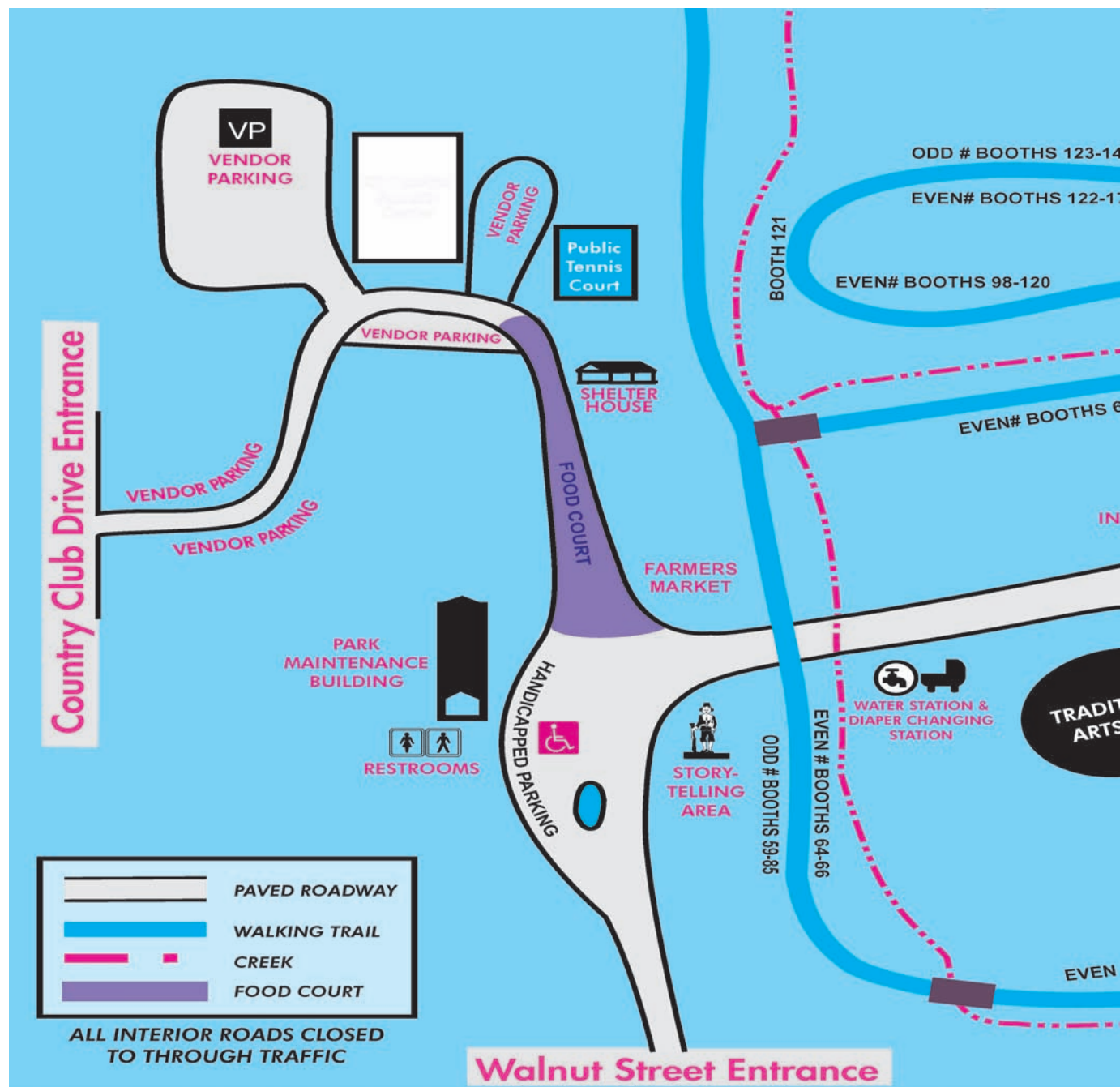

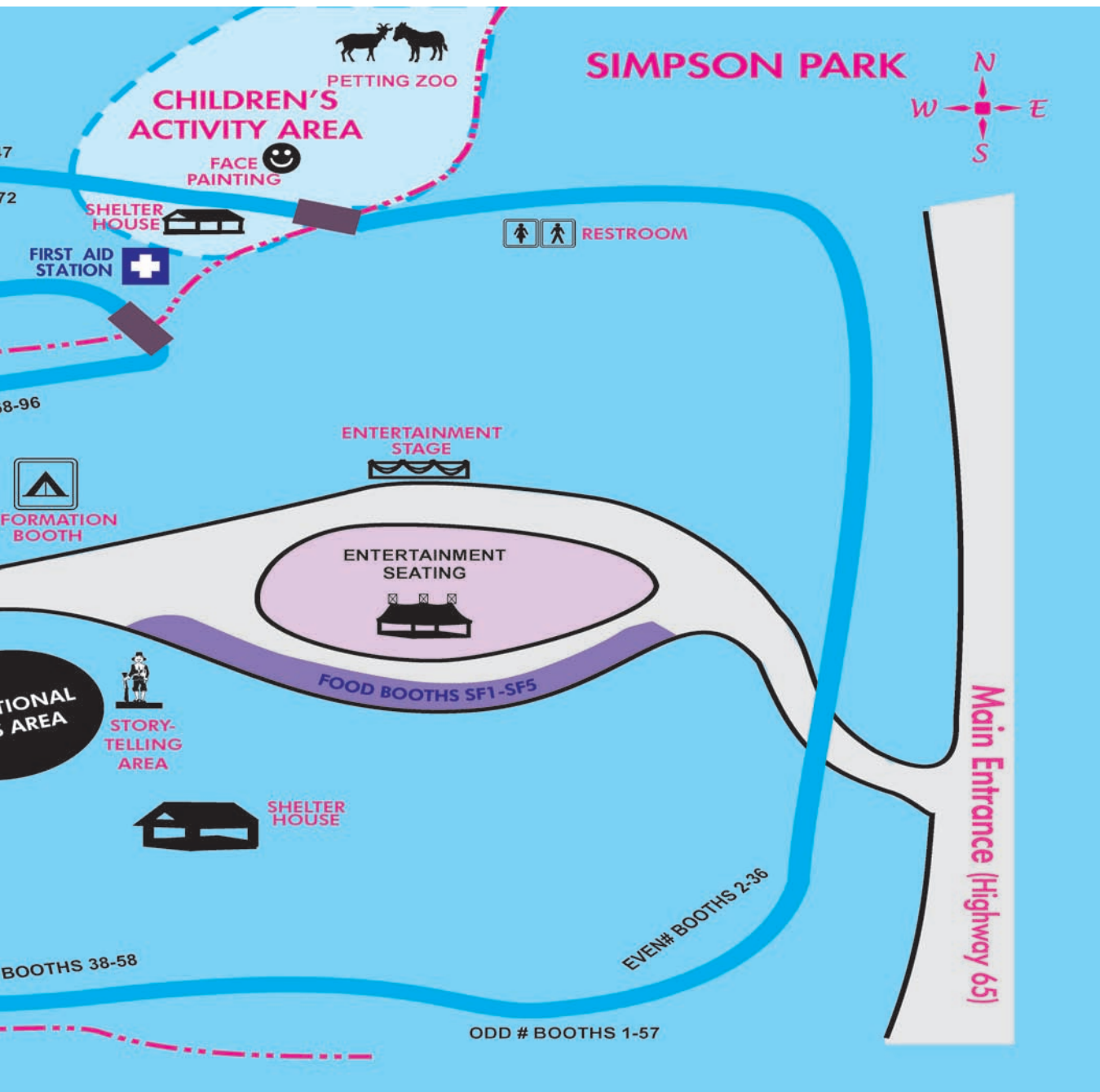

This is their first appearance at Chautauqua.



**Donald Graves** performs with the walking cane dulcimer on stage and in the Traditional Arts Area of Chautauqua. Don is also a luthier (a maker of stringed instruments) and makes walking cane dulcimers. His skill in playing and making instruments has been passed down in his family. He is a fine musician, and a patient and charming demonstrator of the dulcimer. Children really enjoy visiting him in the Traditional Arts Area of Chautauqua.

**Mic-O-Say Dancers** from the Tribe of Mic-O-Say, are members of the Boy Scouts of America. Their ceremonies and traditions are loosely based on the folklore of the American Indian. These young men spend countless hours creating their own Mic-O-Say costumes and practicing and performing their dances. They are a Chautauqua tradition that is always enjoyed.

**Master Storyteller Loretta Graves** is back at Chautauqua by popular demand. Ms. Washington is from St. Louis, and has done a huge amount of work for the Missouri Humanities Council, and has presented many programs for the Humanities Council's Read First program. Ms. Washington is recognized throughout Missouri for her workshops on story telling, and for her masterfully crafted stories of American Folklore and African-American history. She is co-sponsored for Chautauqua by the Friends of the Livingston County Library and by the Chillicothe Area Arts Council.



**Meller Fellers**, who describe themselves as just "two laid-back musicians" have a musical performance history that assures an audience of fine musicianship, great variety, and a very fun time. Clive Renfroe, of Brookfield, spent much of his life playing with other great jazz musicians in the Kansas City jazz scene. Chillicothean John (Corky) Hesler learned to play drums as a kid in Trenton, and has played with numerous bands throughout the area over many years. The audience can expect great jazz, great blues and great rock 'n roll.

**Kindred Spirits:** This exciting new group of country-bluegrass gospel performers are well-known among bluegrass fans in the Chillicothe-Trenton area. They recently teamed up to form the band Kindred Spirits, and they are bringing their skill and passion for music to Chautauqua. The group features vocalist Mary Lou VanDeventer, Chillicothe, on keyboard; Jan VanDeventer, Chillicothe, on bass guitar; Jack Bain, Trenton, acoustical lead guitar and banjo; Marilyn Bain, Trenton, vocalist; and Larry Deskins, Chillicothe, acoustical guitar.

**Mike Hibner and Angel Dennis** lead the contemporary worship music at the Chillicothe United Methodist Church each Sunday. For Chautauqua they will be sharing their extraordinary voices and beautiful gospel tunes.

**The Gorsett Twins**, Jenny and Patty Jo, perform folk and contemporary music with Jenny on acoustical guitar and Patty Jo on the bass or bongos. Jenny and Patty have written most of their own music, and they have a new CD! Daughters of Pat and Holly Gorsett, they have been playing music at Chautauqua since they were knee-high to a banjo. They are always fun and their blend of voices makes for wonderful entertainment.

**Fictive Kinship** is a four-member band playing country and blues. Fictive Kinship performed last year at Chautauqua amidst rave reviews. We are happy to be bringing them back. A group of high school students from the Master Arts class judges all booths and awards the Area Art Council's "Students' Choice Award" of \$100. This award is announced on Saturday.

#### **Peoples' Choice Award—\$50**

The "People's Choice Award" of \$50 goes to the booth selected by people attending Chautauqua. Each person attending Chautauqua has the opportunity to fill out a short 3-question survey in which they list the number of their favorite Chautauqua booth. The booth with the most votes wins the "People's Choice Award". This award is announced Saturday afternoon. **All survey votes must be placed in orange buckets at a Chautauqua entrance, or at the information desk by 2 p.m. Sunday. Each voter also has a chance to win \$50 cash through a drawing**

#### **Drawing from 3-Question Survey—\$50**

A winner of \$50 in cash is chosen by drawing a survey from all the surveys turned in as votes for the People's Choice Award. You do not have to be present at Chautauqua to win. You will be notified, and a check will be mailed to you.
